



FAQ: New ULI Membership Structure

1. Why an increase in membership dues and a new membership structure?

ULI’s global membership structure has changed. To align Asia and to reflect the investment we are making to grow the platform, we are raising our dues. As we continue to invest in the region to expand the value proposition of ULI membership, we look forward to your continued support and hope that you will continue to be a member in good standing of ULI.

2. What are the new membership types and dues? What has changed?

As of July 1, there will be just two individual memberships, Full member and Associate member, with standard discounts for members in the public sector, those under 35, students, and retired members. Existing members will be placed in the new structure on a rolling basis, as their memberships are renewed.

3. Will a Young Leader program still be offered?

Yes, the Young Leader Group is an important part of ULI’s program and culture. It will now be a program activity rather than a member category. This is a subtle but important change. The YLG will still be offered and will be open to any ULI members under age 35. The Young Leader Group activities will become primarily for ULI members-only, with a percentage open to nonmembers to encourage recruitment.

4. What has changed in terms of volunteering and leadership opportunities?

ULI members are encouraged to give back by volunteering time, talent, or through charitable contributions. Committee assignments and leadership positions are only open to ULI members (Full or Associate).

5. What member benefits will be offered?

Members will get more value for their dues. ULI has standardized the member discount for books, events, and education programs and offers programs for members-only. Over the course of the next year, we will offer information that is accessible only to ULI members behind a “member wall” and online communities that offer member to member connections and interaction within Asia and around the world.

6. Will ULI Asia Pacific Corporate Membership be offered?

ULI Asia Pacific now offers the ULI Asia Pacific Corporate Sustaining Membership. This membership category is by invitation only and open to companies and government agencies that wish to support ULI at the entity level. The ULI Asia Pacific Corporate Sustaining Membership offers more benefits to the company, such as highly visible recognition, a fungible membership roster and centralized accounts payable. All ULI Asia Pacific Corporate Sustaining members receive special discounts on incremental membership, access to special events and activities and will be appointed a dedicated relationship manager from ULI Asia Pacific.
